### Larry Martin's WWII: In Their Own Words

Larry Martin will profile Werner Klemm from the United States Navy. Werner survived the attack on Pearl Harbor. He enlisted in 1940. Werner was stationed aboard the USS Dobbin, a destroyer at Pearl Harbor, on December 7th, 1941. The USS Dobbin was attacked by the Japanese with the loss of several crewmen. Werner was 200 yards from Battleship Row, which included the USS Arizona, USS Nevada and USS Oklahoma, when they were hit by Japanese bombers from six Japanese Aircraft carriers about 200 miles to the north of Hawaii. WWII memorabilia will be on display.
