Sun Party: View the Solar Eclipse

Monday, August 21st from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m.

Drop in to learn about safely viewing a solar eclipse and make a pinpoint viewer.

This is the first total solar eclipse to be visible in the contiguous United States since 1979. We will have a partial eclipse in our area with the best viewing time at approximately 2:21 p.m. EDT. Watch the eclipse with us at the Lincoln Township Community Park behind the Library. Eclipse viewing glasses will be available at the event, while supplies last. In case of inclement weather, we will view the eclipse online in the Lawrence Room at the library. Glasses were donated through a collaboration between the Space Science Institute, Star_Net (sponsored by NASA), and The Moore Foundation.
